Robert J. LaFortune North American Living Museum

Take a trip across our continent: from polar bears to peccaries; from bobcats to sharks. Living plants and animals are combined with cultural displays in this 4-building complex.

Chimpanzee Connection

Watch chimps interact on their outdoor "playground" or enjoy an "up-close" encounter indoors.

Tropical American Rain Forest

See jaguars and howler monkeys, piranhas, and many more creatures, in a lush, tropical environment filled with more than 3,500 plants.

Children's Zoo

Kids of all ages can get up-close to domestic residents such as goats and pigs (contact yard seasonal), plus see kangaroos, emus & more!

African Penguin Habitat

Visit Tulsa's newest "webbed site" and watch this flock of waddlers in a state-of-the-art exhibit with wave machine, underwater viewing, and special nesting area for kids.

Conservation Center

A variety of reptiles (including a nursery), aquatic animals, primates, and exotic birds.

African Savanna

Giraffes, ostriches, zebras, gazelles, kudus, cheetahs, meerkats, and other exotic species.

Elephant Encounter

Observe some of the world's largest mammals and experience interactive museum exhibits.

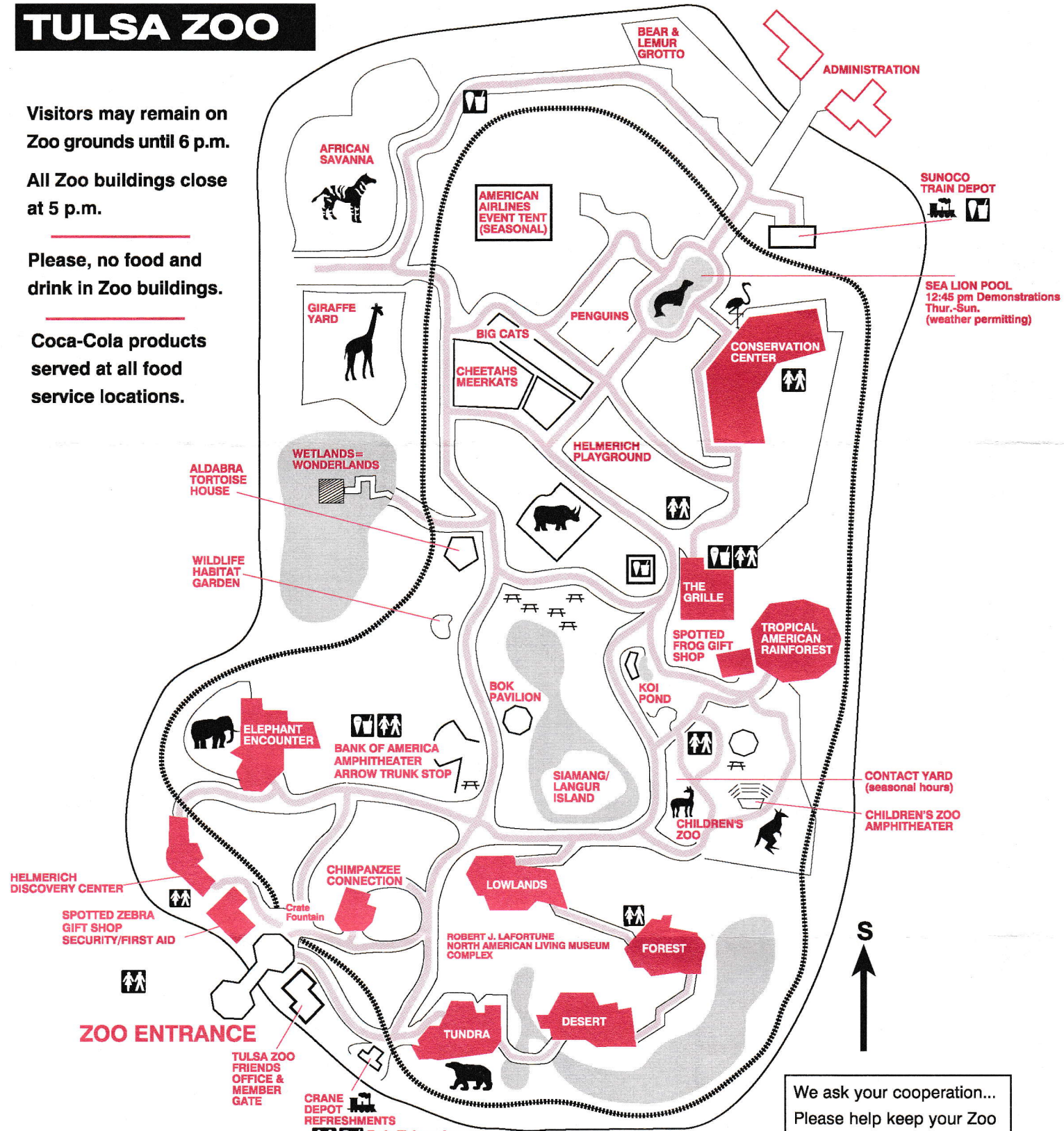
