- Gas fires only, except on days of declared Total Fire Ban (CFS broadcast notices on local radio 891 ABC and 765 5CC or check CFS hotline 1300 362
- Camp only in designated areas
- Conserve native habitat by using liquid fuel or gas stoves
- Respect geological and heritage sites.
- Keep our wildlife wild do not feed or disturb animals or remove native plants.
- Keep to defined vehicle tracks and walking trails
- Help prevent the spread of the deadly cinnamon fungus please comply with walking trailhead instructions.
- Be considerate of other Park users

Thank you for leaving the bush in its natural state for the enjoyment of others.

Always remember: Wildlife Watching Guidelines

- Stay on the trail.
- Put the animals' welfare first
- Move slowly and quietly.
- Observe from a distance.
- Use binoculars for that close-up look

Please Don't Feed The Wildlife

Let them fend for themselves because:

- Human food is poisonous to wildlife it seriously disrupts their natural digestive
- Feeding changes natural behaviour patterns which are essential for survival in
- Feeding can cause dangerous situations when animals become aggressive and cause injury.

Walk Safely

Be prepared when bushwalking:

- Wear sturdy shoes.
- Carry sufficient drinking water
- Keep to the defined walking trail and follow the markers.
