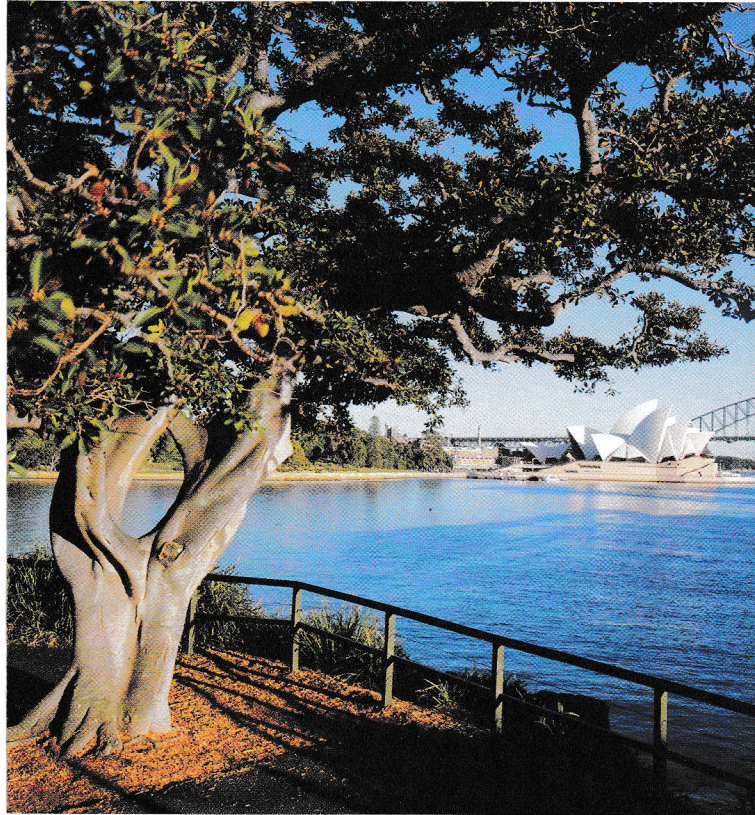

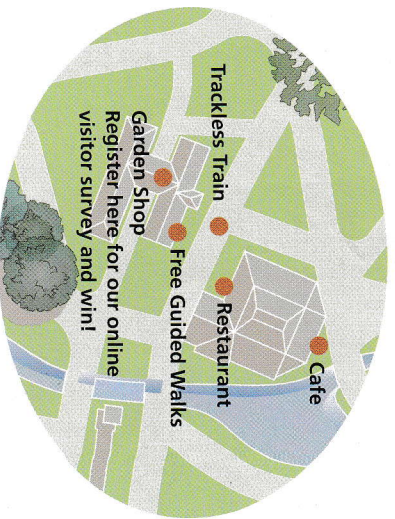
THINGS TO SEE & DO ALL-YEAR-ROUND

Map reference PALM GROVE CENTRE

- N7** Nestled within the Palm Grove in the centre of the Royal Botanic Garden you'll find:
- Garden Shop and online visitor survey
 - Botanic Gardens Restaurant and Cafe
 - Visitor Information Counter
 - Toilets
 - Meeting point for guided walks
 - Trackless train

Take a guided walk, board the trackless train, buy that special gift or book, or enjoy some refreshments.

Garden Shop: we specialise in botanically-inspired gifts. Open 9.30 am to 5 pm daily. Tel: 9231 8125.

Botanic Gardens Restaurant & Cafe: lunches from 12 noon daily, brunch on weekends. Cafe open daily, 8.30 am to 4.30 pm. Tel: 9241 2419.

Free guided walks: daily at 10.30 am, from the Palm Grove Centre (except Christmas, Boxing Day & Good Friday). Lunchtime walks weekdays Mar – Nov at 1 pm.

Trackless train: every 30 mins from near the Opera House (weather permitting), with several stops including the Garden Shop. Charges apply.

Wheelchairs: available from the Garden Shop. Accessible routes and toilets are available.

Map reference MIDDLE GARDENS

- O9 Wolllemi Pine:** this living 'dinosaur' tree is one of the world's rarest plants, first discovered in 1994.
- P-10 Succulent Garden:** see prickly cacti and other species that have evolved bizarre shapes to survive their harsh, arid environments. Open 8 am to 4 pm daily.
- O-8 Cadi Jam Ora — First Encounters:** gain insight into the struggle of the Indigenous Cadigal people as they first encountered European settlers.
- P-7 Fernery:** find out about ferns — where they grow, how they differ from other plants, and how ancient some of them are. Open 9 am to 4.30 pm daily.

O-8 Begonia Garden: tropical and subtropical begonias with spectacular flowers and foliage.

O-8 Camellia Garden: species, hybrids and cultivars, including Australian-bred cultivars.

O-10 National Herbarium of NSW: houses our collection of over one million preserved plants and is the centre of our conservation and research programs.

P-8 Palm House: open 10 am to 4 pm during exhibitions.

O-11 Lion Gate Lodge: exhibitions and functions.

PALACE GARDENS

N-3 Palace Gate Cafe: open weekdays 8 am – 5 pm and Sat 9.30 am – 4.30 pm, closed Sun. Tel: 9252 5779.

M-4 Old Mill Garden and Greenway Terrace: displays of subtropical plants, ornamental grasses, ground covers, and plots of turf grasses.

N-4 Rose Garden & Pavilion: traditional design elements, striking colour combinations and the romance of red, pink and white roses.

P-5 Tropical Centre: temporarily closed.

O-6 Rainforest Walk: follow the pathways beneath the rainforest canopy where you'll see a variety of plants.

LOWER GARDENS

M-6 Herb Garden: delight your senses as you discover culinary, medicinal and aromatic herbs from around the world. Experience a sensory fountain and see a sundial modelled on the celestial sphere.

M-7 HSBC Oriental Garden: wild and cultivated plants from warm-temperate and subtropical areas of China, Japan and Vietnam.

BENNELONG

- H-4 Government House Grounds:** classic garden displays and manicured lawns. Open 10 am – 4 pm. Closed Good Friday, Christmas Day and during functions.
- F-6 Australian Native Rockery:** stunning displays of Australian plants, especially during springtime flowering.

S-8 Pavilion Restaurant and Kiosk: opposite Art Gallery of NSW. Open daily 9 am – 4 pm. Kiosk open 7.30 am – 4.30 pm daily. Tel: 9232 1322.

T-9 Art Gallery of NSW: open daily 10 am – 5 pm and to 10 pm on Weds, except 18 Dec 2013 & 1 Jan 2014.

DOMAIN: YURONG & TARPEIAN PRECINCTS

E-13 Mrs Macquaries Point: vantage point for photographing the Opera House and Harbour Bridge.

F-14 Mrs Macquaries Chair: an early 19th century carved rock ledge seat from where Elizabeth Macquarie, the Governor's wife, watched the Harbour.

H-13 Fleet Steps: an excellent vantage point for photographing the Opera House and Harbour Bridge.

O-12 Mrs Macquaries Bushland Walk: walk through bushland along Woolloomooloo Bay as it would have been when Mrs Macquarie walked to her 'Chair'.

K-14 Andrew Boy Charlton Pool: swimming pool with a view! Open Sept – April.

F-3 Tarpeian Way: historic area of the Domain overlooking the Opera House and Harbour.

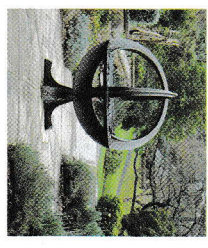

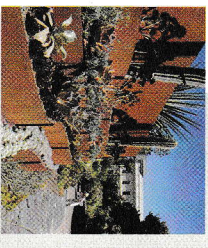

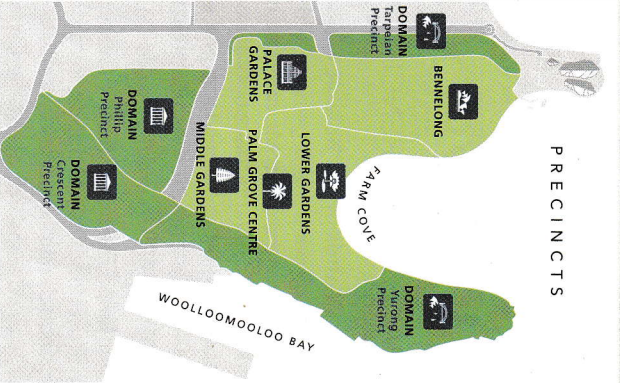
