Sailing at the Museum

Experience the sparkling Waitemata Harbour, taking in the city skyline including the iconic Auckland Harbour Bridge, aboard some of Auckland's unique heritage sailing vessels.

Ted Ashby is a ketch-rigged deck scow, typical of the fleet of scows that once operated in northern New Zealand waters. She sails twice daily Wednesday to Sunday.



Breeze is a square-rigged brigantine. She is a traditional wooden tall ship similar to vessels used in the New Zealand coastal and inter-Dominion trades in the 19th and early 20th centuries.



SS Puke is one of New Zealand's oldest working steamboats, built in the late 1800's. Puke's 15 minute trips are included in the price of admission.

Voyager's galleries take you on a journey of discovery through maritime stories that have shaped our nation's history.



There is so much to discover about New Zealand's proud maritime history, only at Voyager.

Aotearoa Evolves showcases temporary exhibitions that explore the ever changing face of an island nation, including international and locally developed exhibitions.

Blue Water Black Magic - A Tribute to Sir Peter Blake

celebrates the rise of New Zealand as a yachting nation, explores the themes of innovation, teamwork and success. This exhibition also serves as a tribute to one of New Zealand's best loved sons, Sir Peter Blake.

Landfalls covers the pioneering voyages of discovery that colonised New Zealand from the discovery journey from Hawaiki to the exploration of Europe's most famous sailors and the establishment of the first European settlements.

New Beginnings explores the lives of our earliest European settlers.

Discover the rough and tough stories of whaling and sealing and experience life aboard a 19th century immigrant ship on a three month journey from England.

Te Waka is a widescreen animation telling of the first great Polynesian peoples' journey of migration to Aotearoa.

Kiwis and the Coast explores our relationship with and love of New Zealand's coastline, beaches, rivers and waterways.

Edmiston Gallery of Maritime Art portrays stories of courage, tragedy, triumph and our intrinsic bond with the ocean, all expressed through maritime art.

Voyager Maritime Museum

Voyager tells the stories of New Zealand's rich maritime history, from the Polynesian people's epic migration and arrival in Aotearoa, to early European discoveries and settlement, through to modern yachting success.

Our spirit of exploration has been forged and the boundaries of possibility broken by our relationship with




the sea. From this spirit emerged many of the world's greatest maritime pioneers. Our Museum honours them and those who sailed to the limits of their imagination.

New Zealand is a country surrounded by ocean, and at Voyager you will discover how our nation's relationship with the sea has shaped our identity.

Voyager is located in the heart of Auckland's Viaduct Harbour, on the corner of Quay and Hobson Streets. The Museum is a five minute walk from Britomart Transport Centre  and a two minute walk from the ferry terminal . Parking is available in the Downtown Car Park , with access from Customs Street West.

ADMISSION

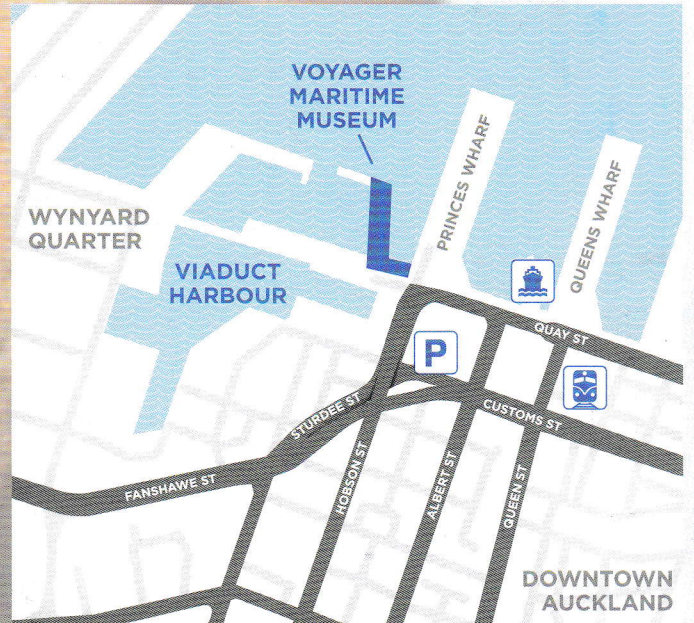
Museum entry from \$17. Museum entry and sailing combo from \$29. Senior, student and child concessions apply.

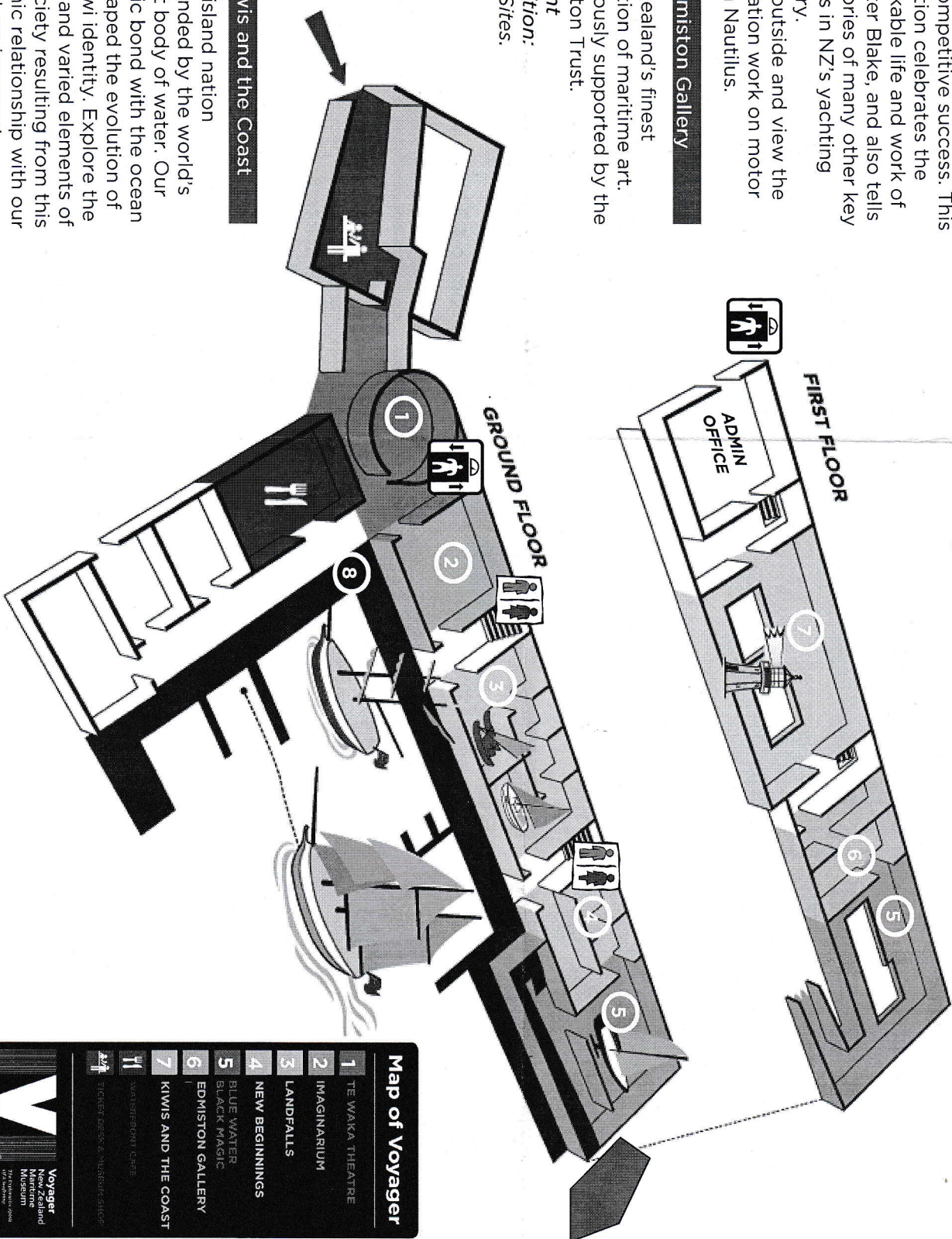
6 - Edmiston Gallery
