

Sailing at the Museum

Experience the sparkling Waitemata Harbour, taking in the city skyline including the iconic Auckland Harbour Bridge, aboard some of Auckland's unique heritage sailing vessels.

Ted Ashby is a ketchrigged deck scow, typical of the fleet of scows that once operated in northern New Zealand waters. She sails twice daily Wednesday to Sunday

Kiwis and the Coast explores our relationship with and love of New Zealand's coastline, beaches, rivers and waterways.


Edmiston Gallery of Maritime Art portrays stories of courage, tragedy triumph and our intrinsic bond with the ocean, all expressed through maritime art
