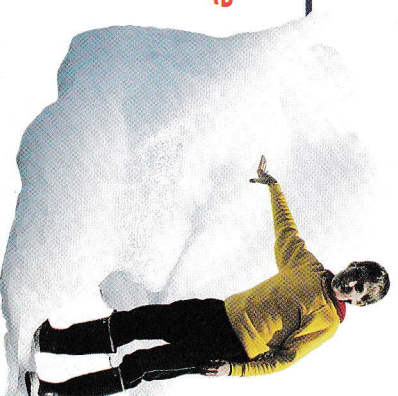
Trip B—Growler Island Wilderness Adventure

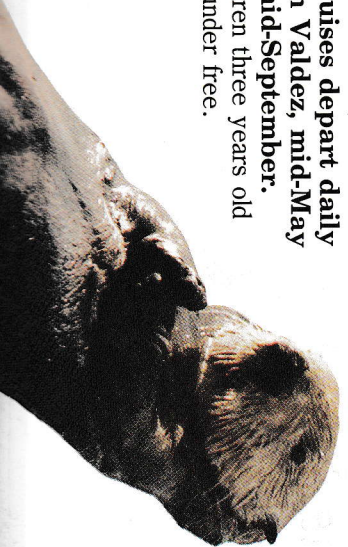
Trip C—Economy Cruise (5½—6 hour cruise)

For all our trips—The average temperature at Columbia Glacier is 40 degrees. Please bring warm clothing for this part of the trip. We recommend dressing in layers, so you will be more comfortable when we arrive on Growler Island where it is much warmer. Wear comfortable walking shoes.

Trip A—Columbia Glacier and Prince William Sound Excursion (8—8½ hours)

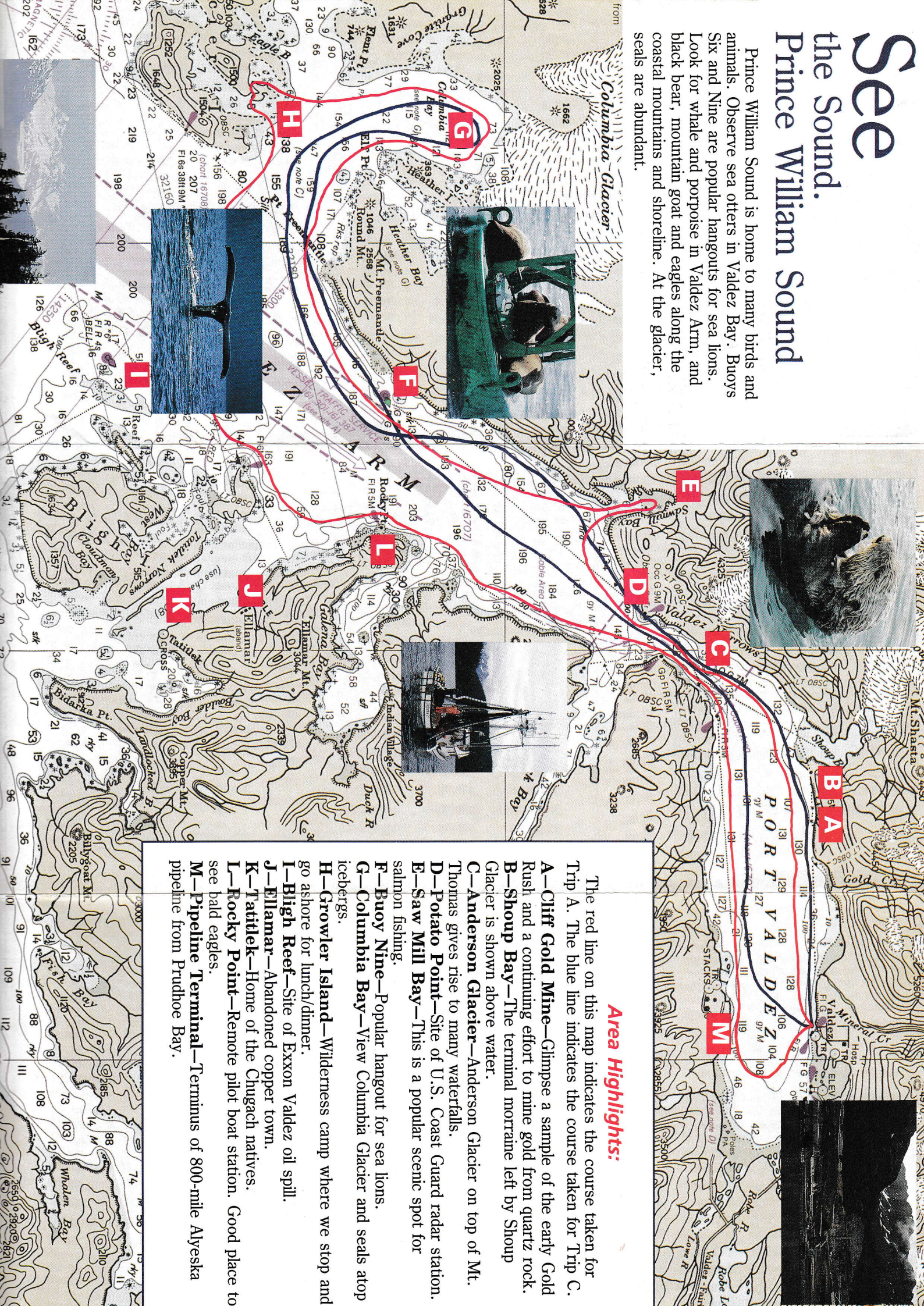
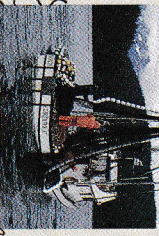
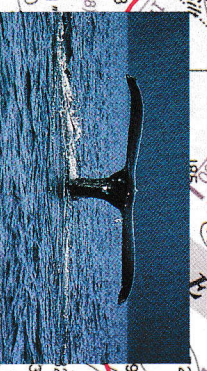
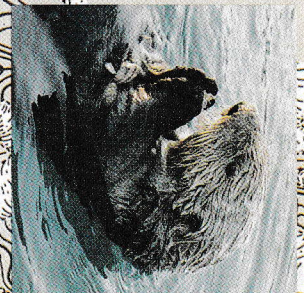
Cruises depart daily from Valdez, mid-May to mid-September. Children three years old and under free.

Prince William Sound

Prince William Sound is home to many birds and animals. Observe sea otters in Valdez Bay. Buoys Six and Nine are popular hangouts for sea lions. Six and Nine are popular hangouts for sea lions. Look for whale and porpoise in Valdez Arm, and black bear, mountain goat and eagles along the coastal mountains and shoreline. At the glacier, seals are abundant.



Area Highlights:

- A—Cliff Gold Mine**—Glimpse a sample of the early Gold Rush and a continuing effort to mine gold from quartz rock.
- B—Shoup Bay**—The terminal moraine left by Shoup Glacier is shown above water.
- C—Anderson Glacier**—Anderson Glacier on top of Mt. Thomas gives rise to many waterfalls.
- D—Potato Point**—Site of U.S. Coast Guard radar station.
- E—Saw Mill Bay**—This is a popular scenic spot for salmon fishing.
- F—Buoy Nine**—Popular hangout for sea lions.
- G—Columbia Bay**—View Columbia Glacier and seals atop icebergs.
- H—Growler Island**—Wilderness camp where we stop and go ashore for lunch/dinner.
- I—Bligh Reef**—Site of Exxon Valdez oil spill.
- J—Ellamar**—Abandoned copper town.
- K—Taittlek**—Home of the Chugach natives.
- L—Rocky Point**—Remote pilot boat station. Good place to see bald eagles.
- M—Pipeline Terminal**—Terminus of 800-mile Alyeska pipeline from Prudhoe Bay.
