





SAMGÖNGUSAÐNIÐ Í SKÓGUM

Samgöngusafnið í Skógum var opnað í nýju sýningarhúsi þann 20. júlí árið 2002. Hér birtist þróun samgangna og tækni á Íslandi á 19. og 20. öld. Hlutverk Samgöngusafnsins er söfnun, varðveisla og sýning muna og minnja um þróun samgangna í landinu, allt frá ferðalögum á hestum til rafænna samskiptu dagsins í dag.

Helstu samstarfsaðilar safnsins sem jafnframt sýna safngripi sína hér eru Þjóðminjasafn Íslands, Vélagrðin, Íslandsþóstur, Mila, Landhelgisgæslan, Ránik, Síminn og Slysvarnafélagið Landsbjörg, auk merklegra gripa frá Skágasafni og Taliðvöasafni Sigga Harðar.

I Samgöngusafni er verslun fyrir ferðamenn og veitingastaðurinn Skógakaffi. Samgöngusafnið í Skógum er hluti af Byggðasafni Rangá einga og Vestur-Skattfellinga, sem er eitt stærsta og mest sóttu safn á landinu.

MUSEUM OF TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

The Museum of Transport and Communication in Skógar was opened July 20th 2002 in a new exhibition hall. Here is on display the history and evolution of transport, communication and technology in Iceland in the 19th and 20th centuries, from the age of the working horse to the digital communication of today. The museum's aim is to collect, preserve and exhibit artifacts that tell this story.

The museums main sponsors who exhibit their artifacts here are The National Museum of Iceland, The Roadworks, Icelandic Mail, Icelandic Coast Guard, RARIK-Electric Network, Mila, Síminn Telephone and Landsbjörg SAR, plus many interesting exhibits from The Skógar Museum. The exhibition hall has an excellent souvenir shop and the Skágakaffi Café. The Museum of Transport and Communication is part of The Skógar Regional Museum which is among the largest and most popular museums in Iceland.
