

- The Museum of London opened in 1976, and the collections displayed in its permanent galleries represent over 2000 years of the capital's social history. The collections are wide-ranging and include archaeological artefacts, costumes, paintings, prints and photographs, and items of royal, social and industrial significance.
- The galleries are arranged so that you can start at the beginning and progress through to the 20th century. Or, if you are interested in a particular period of history, you can go straight to that gallery and begin your visit there.
