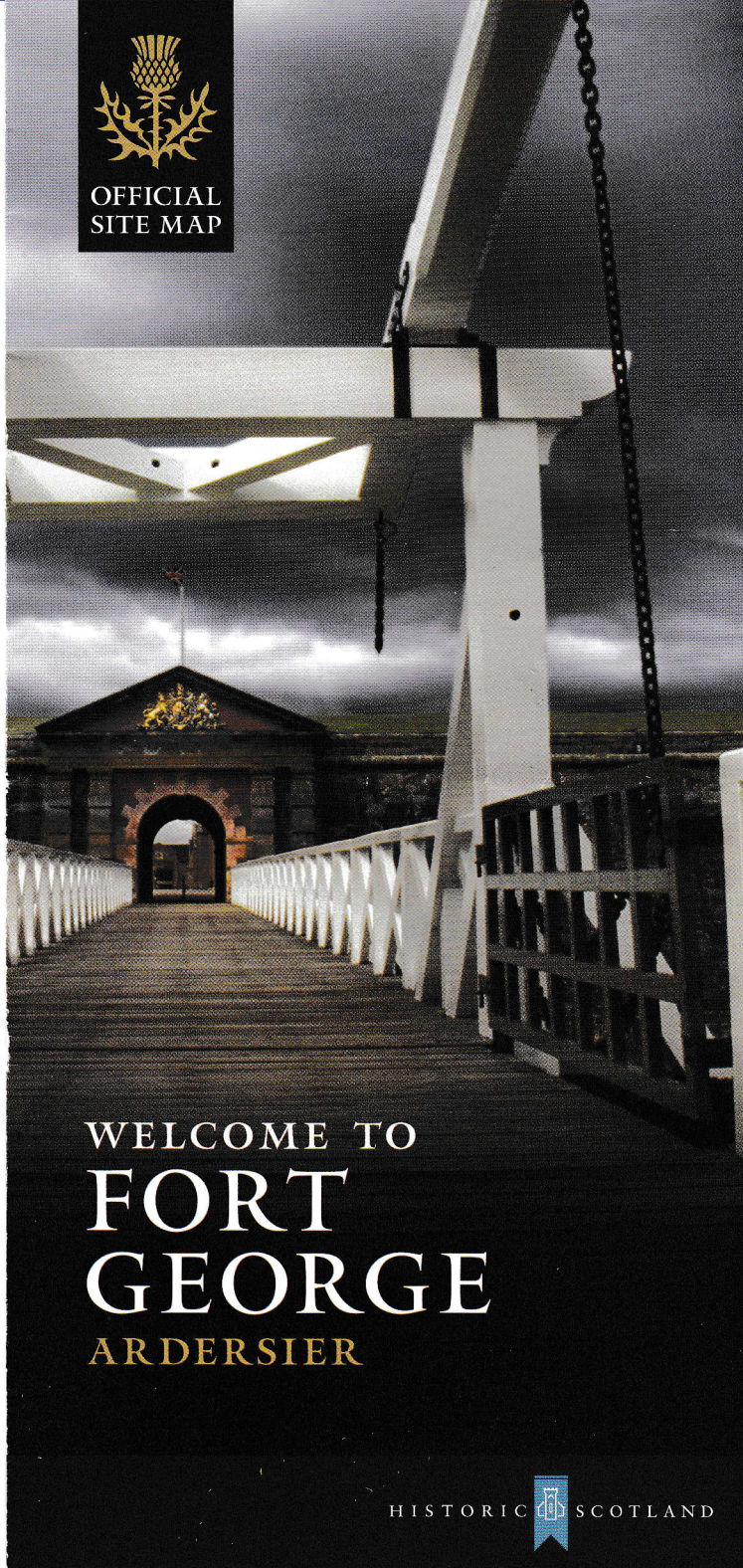

ACCESS

SAFETY

Fort George has many sudden drops. Please take care when walking on the ramparts and stay away from the edge.

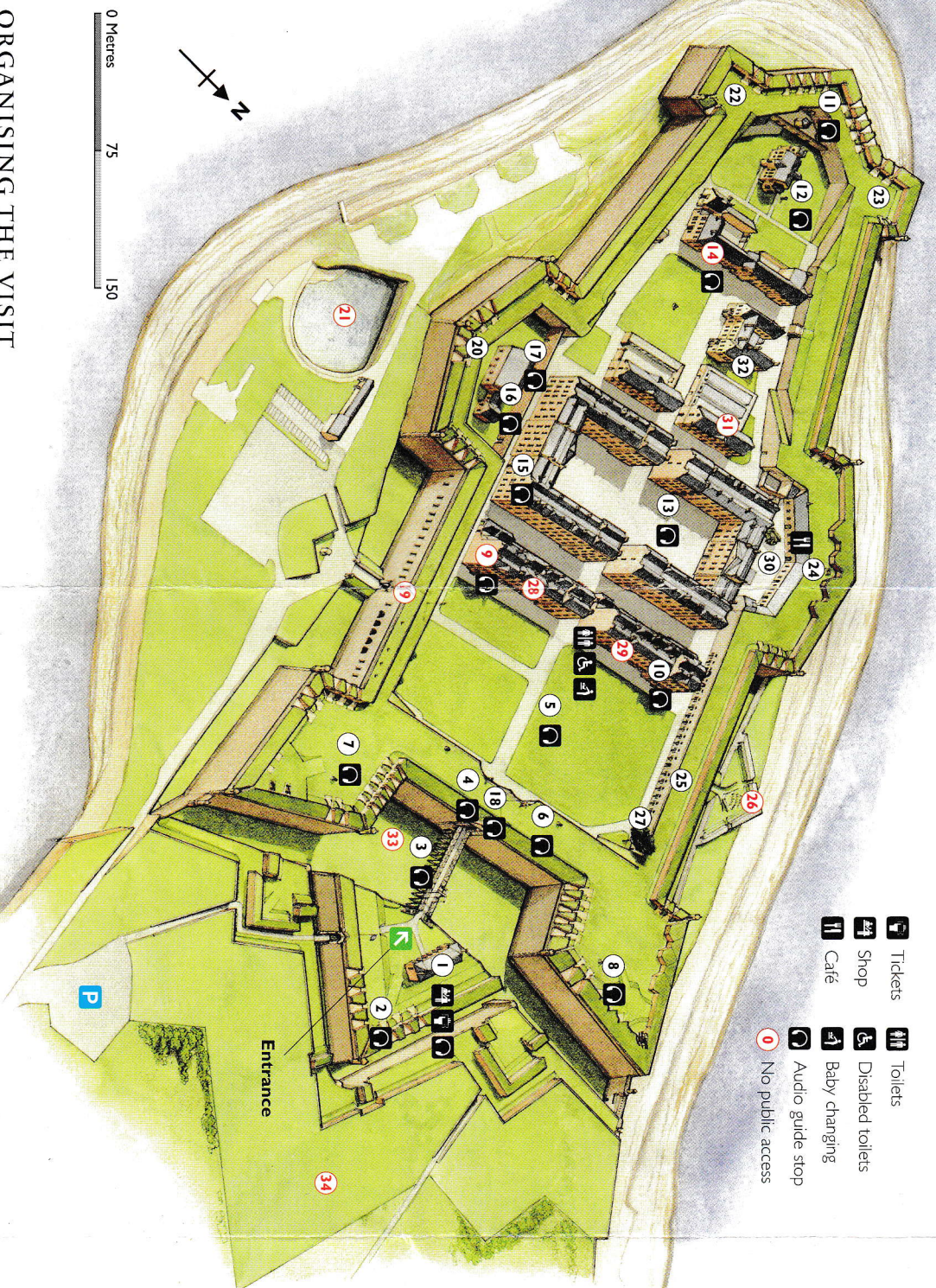
If you hear an alarm please make your way to the Parade Ground (no. 5 on the map) where staff will give you further instructions.

Military vehicles and staff cars are permitted in the Fort, please watch out for these.

ACCESSIBILITY

Wheelchairs are available on loan. Please ask a member of staff.

FORT GEORGE IS AN ACTIVE MILITARY BASE
You may see soldiers at work and encounter military vehicles during your visit today. Some of the buildings in the Fort are used by the army and are not open to the public (the map will help you find the buildings that are open) and for security reasons staff may ask to search your bags.



ORGANISING THE VISIT

PLANNING YOUR VISIT

Fort George covers a large area – about 42 acres or the size of 40 football pitches – and there is more than a mile of ramparts that you can walk along.

We recommend that you allow at least 2 hours to complete the tour. Please ask a member of staff for help when planning your visit.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

You might see conservation work taking place today. This is part of Historic Scotland's commitment to care for these historic buildings.

During your visit today, please do not smoke and please switch off your mobile phone when you are in the Garrison Chapel (no. 12 on the map).

For a complete tour of the Fort try taking an audio-guide. They are available in 6 languages and offer a tour lasting approximately 1 hour.

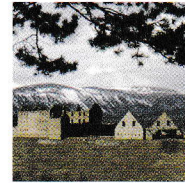

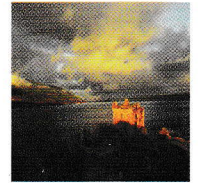
